Cookie Policy

NOTE: Capitalised terms not otherwise defined in this document bear the meaning specified in Schedule 1 to this Cookie Policy.

Introduction

- A. Company uses cookies to help provide, protect and improve Company services.
- B. This Policy describes the cookies we use and explains why we use cookies and how we deal with the collected information. It also explains how cookies enable Company Platform to function properly and why you may not be able to experience the full functionality of the Platform if you disable the use of cookies. Company Cookie Policy should be read alongside, and in addition to, our Terms of Use and our Privacy Policy.
- C. By visiting our Platform without changing your settings, you agree to receive all cookies and other data collection tools; however, if you do not accept the use of these cookies, you can change your cookie settings at any time by following the instructions below.

Our Use of Cookie Policy Terms and Conditions

1. What Are Cookies?

- (a) Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information, which are downloaded to your computer or mobile device when you visit a certain webpage. Cookies are then sent back to the originating webpage on each subsequent visit, or to another webpage, that recognizes that cookie. Cookies are widely used in order to make Company Platform work, or to work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the Platform.
- (b) Cookies do lots of different jobs, like letting you navigate between pages efficiently, remembering your preferences, and generally improving the user experience. Cookies may tell us, for example, whether you have visited Company Platform before or whether you are a new visitor. They can also help to ensure that adverts you see online are more relevant to you and your interests.
- (c) There are two broad categories of cookies:
 - i. first party cookies, served directly by us to your computer or mobile device;

- ii. third-party cookies, which are served by a third-party on our behalf. We may use third-party cookies for functionality, performance/analytics, advertising/tracking and social media purposes.
- (d) Cookies can remain on your computer or mobile device for different periods of time. Some cookies are session cookies, meaning that they are stored only temporarily during a browsing session and expire when you close your browser. Other cookies are persistent cookies, meaning that they are saved on your computer or mobile device for a fixed period and are not deleted when browser is closed. They can be used by Company Platform to recognize your computer or mobile device when you open your browser and browse the Internet again.

2. Why Do We Use Cookies?

We use cookies for a variety of reasons, including to:

- i. enable, facilitate and streamline the functioning of and your access to Company Platform;
- ii. track traffic flow and patterns of travel in connection with the Company Platform;
- iii. understand the total number of visitors to our Platform on an ongoing basis and the types of internet browsers (e.g. Firefox, Chrome or Internet Explorer) and operating systems (e.g. Windows or Mac OS) used by our visitors;
- iv. monitor the performance of the Company Platform and continually improve it;
- v. customize and enhance your online experience.

3. What Types of Cookies Do We Use?

The types of cookies used by us and our partners in connection with the Company Platform can be classified into one of five categories, namely cookies necessary for essential Company purposes, 'functionality cookies', performance and analytics cookies, 'advertising and tracking cookies', and 'social media cookies'. We have set out some further information about each category, and the purposes of the cookies we and third-parties set in the following table.

3.1. Cookies necessary for essential Company purposes

These cookies are essential to provide you with the Company Platform and any services available through the Platform and to use some of its features, such as access to secure areas. Without these cookies, services you have asked for, like transactional pages and secure login accounts, would not be possible. Please see the instructions set out in 'How to control or delete cookies' below.

3.2. Functionality Cookies

Functionality cookies record information about choices you have made and allow us to tailor the Company Platform to you. These cookies mean that when you continue to use or come back to the

Platform, we can provide you with our services as you have asked for them to be provided. For example, these cookies allow us to:

- i. Save your location preference if you have set your location on your homepage, if applicable, in order to receive a local weather forecast;
- ii. Remember settings you have applied, such as layout, text size, preferences, and colours;
- iii. Show you when you are logged in; and
- iv. Store accessibility options. Please see the instructions set out in 'How to control or delete cookies' below.

3.3. Performance and Analytics Cookies

We use performance/analytics cookies to analyse how the Company Platform is accessed, used, or is performing in order to provide you with a better user experience and to maintain, operate and continually improve the Platform. For example, these cookies allow us to:

- i. Better understand our Platform visitors so that we can improve how we present our content;
- ii. Test different design ideas for particular pages, such as our homepage;
- iii. Collect information about the Company Platform visitors such as where they are located and what browsers they are using;
- iv. Determine the number of unique users of the Platform;
- v. Improve the Company Platform by measuring any errors that occur; and
- vi. Conduct research and diagnostics to improve product offerings.

We use Google Analytics and many other site web analytics tools that helps us understand how users engage with the Platform. Like many services, these web analytics services use first-party cookies to track user interactions as in our case, where they are used to collect information about how users use our site and how they use it. This information is used to compile reports and create services to help us improve our Platform and the services associated with it. The reports disclose Platform trends without identifying individual visitors. Some services will allow you to opt out of tracking with their services directly. For instance, while you cannot opt out of use of cookies with our site, you can opt out of Google Analytics without affecting how you visit our site. For other web analytics services we may use around the world, please email us at our Company's contact email. Please also see the instructions set out in 'How to control or delete cookies' below.

3.4. Advertising and Tracking Cookies.

We may allow third-party companies, including advertising companies (such as Facebook, Google, Twitter, Quora and Bing), to place cookies on our Platform. These cookies enable such companies to track your activity across various sites where they display ads and record your activities so they can show ads that they consider relevant to you as you browse the Internet. These Cookies store

information about the content you are browsing together with an identifier linked to your device or IP address.

These Cookies also allow us and third-parties to know whether you've seen an ad or a type of ad, and how long it has been since you've last seen it. This information is used for frequency capping purposes, to help tailor the ads you see, and to measure the effectiveness of ads. All the companies or networks that we work with have their own privacy policies and offer a mechanism for users to opt out tracking and behavioural targeting available through the ad itself or through the opt out mechanisms listed in the 'How to control or delete cookies' section below.

3.5. Social Media Cookies

On some pages of our Platform, third-parties that provide applications through our Platform may set their own cookies in order to track the success of their applications or customize applications for you. For example, when you share a content using a social media sharing button on our Platform (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, or Google Plus), the social network that has created the button will record that you have done this. Because of how cookies work, we cannot access these cookies, nor can the third-parties access the data in cookies used by us. Some pages of our Platform may also contain embedded content, such as video content from YouTube, and these third-party sites may set their own cookies. Please see the instructions set out in 'How to control or delete cookies' below.

4. How to Control or Delete Cookies

- (a) You have the right to accept or stop cookies from being stored on your device at any time by modifying the settings in your web browser to reflect your cookie preferences.
- (b) Please be aware that you may not be able to use all the interactive features of our services, the Platform and its content once cookies are disabled.
- (c) Most browsers offer instructions on how to change your cookie settings. These settings will typically be found in the options or preferences menu of your browser. In order to understand these settings, the following links may be helpful, otherwise you should use the 'Help' option in your browser for more details.

- (d) If you only want to limit third-party advertising cookies, you can turn such cookies off by visiting the Links mentioned in Schedule 1.

- (e) Please bear in mind that there may be many more companies listed on these sites than those that drop cookies via the Company Platform.

5. Changes to This Cookie Policy

We will occasionally update this Cookie Policy to reflect changes in our practices and services. When we post changes to this Cookie Policy, we will revise the "Last Updated" date at the top of this Cookie Policy. If we make any material changes in the way we collect, use, and/or share information held in cookies, we will notify you by prominently posting notice of the changes on the Company Platform. We recommend that you check this page from time to time to inform yourself of any changes in this Cookie Policy or any of our other policies.

6. Cookies That Have Been Set in The Past

If you have disabled one or more Cookies, we may still use information collected from cookies prior to your disabled preference being set, however, we will stop using the disabled cookie to collect any further information.
